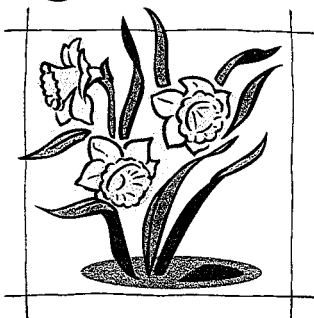

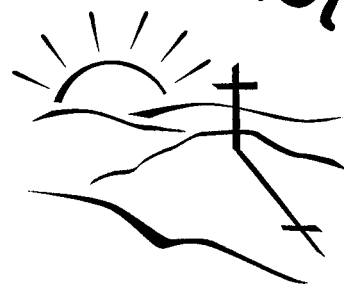

## Knowing the Peace of Jesus Christ

Jesus' greeting to his disciples on that 1<sup>st</sup> Easter was “*Peace to you*”. It's more than an invitation to be calm. Jesus' words remind his follower of teachings he'd offered through both his words and actions.

In John 14 we read that Jesus tells His followers that he'd be taken from them, yet he wouldn't abandon them. Jesus said that God would send the Holy Spirit to encourage them, and his peace would continue to be with them; they had nothing to fear. Jesus declared: “*Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid.*” (John 14:27).

Just days earlier, on that fateful Friday, as Jesus hung on the cross, he uttered words of forgiveness. He forgave those who'd crucified him. Not for the sake of those who wronged him; no, Jesus prayed for forgiveness for all who'd had a part in the engineering of this horrific act of hanging him on the cross. He offered this prayer of forgiveness for himself as well. Jesus forgave those who'd hung him on the cross so that he could die released of the burden of blame, hatred, confusion or whatever human emotion he may have been harboring so that he could die in peace. Jesus prayed: “*Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing.*” (Luke 23:34a).

On that 1<sup>st</sup> Easter, Jesus entered the room and greeted the disciples who'd gathered with the words “*Peace to you.*” These words were an echo of words that they'd heard before; these were words of both promise and instruction. Jesus reminded the 1<sup>st</sup> disciples, and he reminds us as 21<sup>st</sup> century disciples, how to achieve peace. Peace comes when we're able to forgive. Peace comes when we stop holding on to those things and/or those situations which keep us stuck. Anything that continues to keep us mired in anger, fear, sorrow, pain, loss, or despair. Stuck in and with those things that block peace. Peace comes when we forgive. Peace is God's gift to each and every one of us, so that our hearts aren't troubled, and so that we're not afraid.

One of the messages of Easter is to forgive and to know the peace of the risen Christ, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

My prayer as Easter people is that we're each able to receive God's gift of peace in not only our own lives, yet that we're also able to share that peace with others as well.

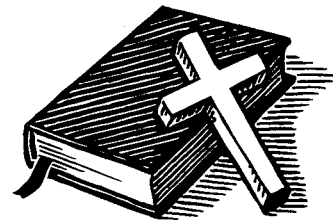

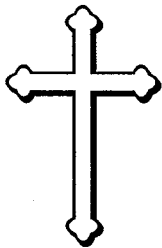

- Pastor's Report:

Pastor Mary discussed Hand2Plow Congregational Revitalization Program. It is a three year process involving laity and the Pastor. There are three laity from Port Gibson making the commitment.

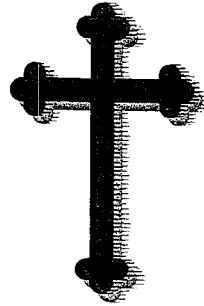

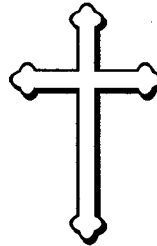


**30 HOUR FAMINE WEEKEND**
